- Monday 6/17 - Tuesday 6/18: 9 AM - 7 PM


***No early voting Sunday 6/16*

WHAT DO I BRING?

Acceptable forms of photo IDs in Texas are:

Texas Driver's License, Texas Handgun License, Texas Election ID, US Military ID w/photo, US Citizenship Certificate w/photo, or US Passport.

Don't have a photo ID?

Bring one of these documents: voter registration certificate, birth certificate, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or government document and obtain a Declaration of Reasonable Impediment at a polling location.

Non-discrimination protections for LGBTQ people		
Full access to reproductive health care		
Paid sick leave for workers		NP

*THE QUESTIONS

1. I support local ordinances/policies that ensure LGBTQ citizens are protected from discrimination in employment, housing, public services and accommodations.
2. I support laws/policies that ensure access to the full range of reproductive health care — including medically accurate sex education and abortion-care — for all individuals.
3. I support local ordinances/policies mandating that workers have the ability to earn paid sick leave to take care of themselves or immediate family members.
4. I support "Smart Justice" policies that place less emphasis on criminalizing conduct and a greater focus on directing resources to address the underlying problems, like substance abuse, mental health issues, and lack of stable housing.
5. I support policies that encourage greater voter participation, including online voter registration and polling locations on college/university campuses.
6. I support local policies that do not force local law enforcement to collaborate with federal immigration enforcement (in situations where collaboration is not required by state or federal law).
