

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

TFN has now been around for more than two decades, and the importance of a progressive grassroots organization like ours only seems to be growing.

Let me tell you a little bit about 2016 and what to expect in 2017.

At the State Board of Education we helped lead the fight against a deeply flawed and highly offensive Mexican-American studies textbook. At the Capitol we stood with our friends to defend the reproductive rights of Texas women. And in many parts of the state, our youth program, Texas Rising, mobilized thousands of young Texans to register to vote and cast a ballot in November.

There was more, but just these three things kept us pretty busy the entire year. Now, in 2017, we expect to be even busier.

For starters, the Texas Legislature will be back in town.

The LGBT community has made some gains since legislators last met, and we expect that LGBT rights will be attacked with renewed ferocity. The U.S. Supreme Court has struck down the state's extreme anti-abortion law, which means you can expect that legislators will again target a woman's right to make her own healthcare decisions.

And as has been the case during every legislative session since TFN has been around, we'll have to push back against private school voucher schemes that threaten our neighborhood public schools.

Those are just a few of the big issues, but one can never tell what far-right lawmakers will propose in any given session.

Also in 2017, at the State Board of Education, we'll have another fight over evolution. Yes, this is the 21st century and we're still somehow debating evolution. That's the SBOE for you. Texas Rising is sure to be busy again. Our organizers will be making sure that all the young Texans that we've engaged in the electoral process stay that way, and that those who follow do the same.

On top of all of that, you can expect to see an extensive update to our groundbreaking 2009 report on what Texas schools are teaching kids about sex education.

None of this work is possible without the generosity of friends like you. We're grateful for your past support and I know that you will have our back in the future. In return, I promise you that TFN will be there whenever your values need a voice at Capitol, at the State Board of Education, and beyond.

TFN helped lead a broad coalition of organizations and scholars from across
Texas to call on the State Board of Education to reject a proposed Mexican-American studies textbook that promoted offensive cultural stereotypes, distorted history and

was plagued by factual errors. With our partners, we collected more than 15,500 petition signatures demanding the board keep the textbook out of our children's classrooms. The board voted in November to #RejectTheText by a vote of 15-0.

Evolution deniers at the board are poised to, once again, try to inject junk science in the state's curriculum standards in 2017. But not if we can help it. Follow the **#StandUp4Science** campaign by registering at tfn.org/science.

TFN's Texas Rising program is a movement of young, diverse, politically engaged Texans working to leverage their power through community organizing, electoral politics and public policy advocacy.


Texas Rising's student leaders advocate for sound public policies that address reproductive rights, LGBT equality, public education and voting rights.



REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND JUSTICE

2016 was a historic year with the Supreme Court decision on the Texas-based case of Whole Woman's Health vs. Hellerstedt.

Alongside our reproductive rights partners, TFN participated in events around the Roe v. Wade anniversary, the March 2 Supreme Court hearing and decision day as well as hosting a series of town halls after the decision in Dallas, Houston and the Rio Grande Valley.

STANDING FOR LGBT EQUALITY

I will never forget the 2015 Texas
Legislature. As a freshman House member,
it was my first legislative session. A few
months earlier, I was honored and humbled
to be elected by the people of my district.

It was not an easy session. That session saw some of my colleagues file more than two dozen anti-LGBT bills that would have discriminated against people like me, my loving partner of 18 years, Celinda, and the people I represent.

Thankfully, every one of those bills was ultimately defeated. Those fights

were, of course, difficult. But at each one, there was TFN standing with us. TFN has been a loyal and effective advocate for LGBT rights in and outside the Capitol.

LGBT Texans don't have full equality yet, and getting there will take lots of hard work that will span many years. I'm comforted that, no matter how long it takes, we can be sure that TFN will be in our corner.


